Whereas, the housing crisis has negative effects at regional and local levels, we believe that every community must do their part to contribute to housing growth and benefit from the positive impacts a healthy housing market brings to communities; and

Whereas, we believe that supporting the housing production of all kinds in our community will bring multiple benefits, including increasing housing access and choices for current and future residents, providing integrated accessible housing options that meet the needs of the people with sensory and mobility disabilities, bringing economic opportunities and vitality to our communities, and allowing workers at all levels to improve their quality of life through living closer to their employment opportunities; and

Whereas, we believe that evidence showing the infill development that reduces sprawl and supports walkable communities has significant environmental and public health benefits; and

Whereas, we believe that affirmatively furthering fair housing and reducing segregation is not only law, required by law, but essential for keeping our community strong and vibrant; and be it

Resolved, that The Town of Hornellsville, in order to take positive steps to alleviate the housing crisis, adopts the Pro-Housing Communities pledge, which will have us endeavor to take the following important steps:

- 1. Streamlining permitting for multifamily housing, affordable housing, accessible housing, accessory dwelling Units, and supportive housing.
- 2. Adopting policies that affirmatively further fair housing.
- 3. Incorporating regional housing needs into planning decisions.
- 4. Increasing development capacity for residential uses.
- 5. Enacting policies that encourage broad range of housing development, including multifamily housing, affordable housing, accessorly dwelling units, and supportive housing.

Resolution 94-2025: Authorizing Payment for Intermunicipal Sewer Evaluation Engineering Services Labella Associates – Proposal #P2504149

Whereas, the Town of Hornellsville is participating in a proposed intermunicipal initiative titled "Sewer Evaluation – Next Steps", to assess shared sewer infrastructure and develop coordinated future improvements; and

Whereas, LaBella Associates DPC has submitted a Proposal for Professional Services (Proposal No. P2504149) dated June 23,2025, for engineering services in support of this initiative, with a total cost of One Hundred Seven Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$107,900.00); and

Whereas, the proposed cost-sharing arrangement would allocate the expense equally among five anticipated participating entities—the Town of Hornellsville, the Village of North Hornell, the City of Hornell, the Steuben County Industrial Development Agency (Steuben County IDA), and the City of Hornell Industrial Development Agency (CHIDA)—with each responsible for one-fifth (1/5) of the total cost, or Twenty-One Thousand Five Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$21,580.00); and

Whereas, the Hornellsville Town Board finds that participation in this project is in the public interest and that the Town's share of the proposed cost is a proper municipal purpose pursuant to General Municipal Law §119-0 and Town Law §64; and be it

Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Hornellsville hereby authorizes the expenditure of \$21,580.00 as its anticipated share of the engineering services described in Proposal #P2504149, subject to finalization of the intermunicipal cost-sharing arrangement; and be it

Further Resolved, that said payment shall be made from [insert account or budget line], and that the Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to take all necessary administrative steps, including entering into agreements, to effectuate the Town's participation.
